Synonyms

1. **Abate**: (of something unpleasant or severe) become less intense or widespread.

Sentence: I married my husband because I know my love for him will never **abate**.

synonyms:

subside, die down/away/out, drop off/away, lessen, ease(off), let up, decrease, diminish, moderate, decline, fade, weaken.

2. **Tepid**: (especially of a liquid) only slightly warm, lukewarm.

Sentence: She lifted her canteen and allowed herself a swallow of the **tepid** water.

synonyms:

lukewarm, warmish, slightly warm; at room temperature

3. **Myriad**: A countless or extremely great number of people or things.

Sentence: Our house has been plagued with **myriad** insects this summer.

synonyms:

multitude, a large/great number/quantity, a lot, scores, quantities, mass, crowd, throng, host, droves, horde, army, legion, sea.

4. **Intrinsic**: belonging naturally, essential.

Sentence: **Intrinsic motivation** is the desire to take on a task simply because it is enjoyable and interesting.

synonyms:

inherent, innate, inborn, congenital, natural, constitutional, built in, deep rooted, inseparable, permanent, indelible, ineradicable, ineffaceable.

5. Feasible: possible and practical to do easily or conveniently.

Sentence: If you have enough time, money, or energy to do something, it's **feasible**.

synonyms:

practicable, practical, workable, achievable, attainable, realizable, viable, realistic, sensible, reasonable

6. Rigid: unable to bend or be forced out of shape; not flexible.

Sentence: This wood is too **rigid** to make a bow with, you need something more flexible.

synonyms:

stiff, hard, firm, inflexible, non-flexible, unbending, unyielding, inelastic

7. Pelting: Hurl missiles repeatedly at.

Sentence: "A boy with an umbrella standing in the **pelting** rain".

synonyms:

bombard, shower, attack, assail, batter, pepper, strafe, rake, sweep, enfilade.

8. Conceded: Agree that something is true after first denying or resisting it.

Sentence: "I had to **concede** that I'd overreacted".

synonyms:

admit, acknowledge, accept, allow, grant, recognize, own, confess.

9. Disparity: A great difference.

Sentence: "Psychological science offers an understanding of **educational disparities** and strategies to redress them".

synonyms:

dissimilar, discrepancy, inconsistency, imbalance, inequality, incongruity, disproportion.

10. Persist: To continue in an opinion.

Sentence: "Being **persistent** is a skill that can help you to reach a goal".

synonyms:

persevere, continue, carry on, go on, keep going, not give up, be persistent, be determined, plough on.
